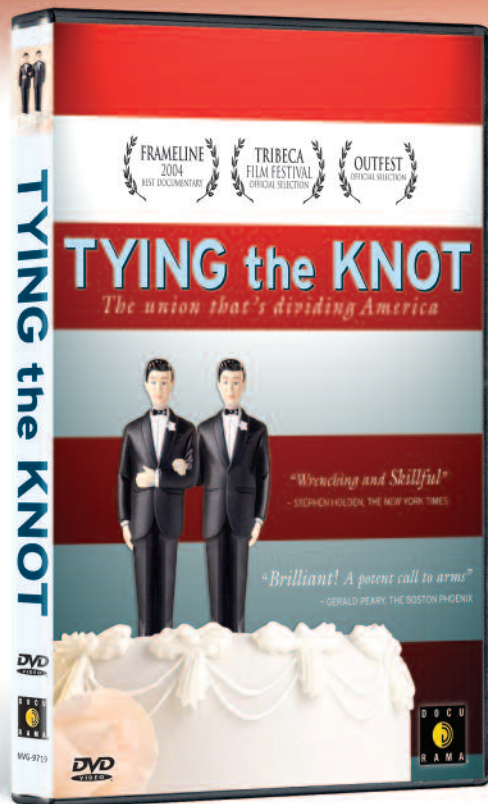


TYING the KNOT
